

### **Morning Routines**

### <u>Transportation</u>

### Student Schedules

Please remember that a great deal of thought and effort goes into creating student schedules, we place students in classes based on the needs of the student. Please do not ask to change a student's schedule based on where his/her friends are scheduled. If you do have questions about your child's schedule please call the East Guidance office.

### **Aspen Family Portal**

Parents may register for view-only access to their child's schedule, attendance and grades. The portal will be opened in early September. ### Immunization/Physical Exam Requirements for Entry into 7th Grade

- a physical exam completed after 9/1/2016
- 1 dose of Tdap (Tetanus, Diphtheria and acellular Pertussis)
- 2 doses of Varicella (Chicken pox) <u>or</u> a physician certified history of chicken pox that includes the month and year.

If you haven't already done so, please send in a copy of your child's physical exam.

If your child is absent, please don't forget to call the Attendance Line. If you know your child is going to be out for longer that one day, for whatever reason (illness, travel, etc.) please let the nurses know the duration of the absence.

### 7<sup>th</sup> Grade BMI Screening

During the first week of school in the fall, all 7<sup>th</sup> grade students will participate in the Massachusetts Body Mass Index (BMI) Screening Program. BMI is a number calculated using a child's age, gender, height and weight. BMI can be a useful tool in identifying possible health risks.

Your child's screening will be conducted by a trained Physical Education teacher. Please know that your child's privacy will be respected at all times. The results of your child's height, weight, and BMI measurement are strictly confidential. You may request a copy of your child's results by contacting the school nurse. You may waive your child's BMI screening by submitting a written request to the school nurse prior to the beginning of the school year.

### East Middle School Soccer and Basketball Teams

If you child plans on trying out for either of these teams during the 2017-2018 school year, a physical exam that is less than 12 months old <u>must be on file</u> in the Health Office <u>prior to tryouts</u>. Soccer tryouts will be in September, basketball tryouts will be in November. If you have any questions about the physical exam requirements please call.

### EAST MIDDLE SCHOOL WELLNESS WALL

Welcome back to school everyone! All of us in the P.E. department are very excited for this upcoming school year. We have a couple new additions to our program this year. Joining us are Mr. Caffelle and Ms. Leader and both of them are really looking forward to a great first year here at East.

We want to make sure all students in P.E. class start the year off on the right foot and are prepared for another great school year.

#### Reminders....

- All students must change out of their school clothes and into appropriate P.E. clothes in order to receive full credit for class.
- P.E. uniform: T-shirt/long sleeve shirt and athletic shorts
- Must wear sneakers. Boots, sandals, Sperry's, Uggz, etc. are not allowed.
- Each student will have their own locker and lock, where you will lock up your clothes and any other small items in our locker rooms.
- We strongly suggest that students use deodorant after class is over. You can leave the extra stick of deodorant in your locker so you don't forget it.
- Optional items: an extra pair of sneakers, extra pair of socks, athletic pants, and a light jacket.
- Most of all we want to make sure you have fun this year in P.E. and learn about how to keep your body active and health through a variety of physical activities.

In addition, sixth grade students will need to pay a one-time \$5.00 fee for their P.E. lock that covers them for all 3 years at East. This is different from your homeroom lock. Cash or check (written out to East Middle School) should be given to your P.E. teacher, not your homeroom teacher. The P.E. teachers will collect the cash or checks and keep track of who paid for their locks. That list and all of the money will be handed into the main office at the end of each school day. For all grades, there is a \$5.00 replacement fee for any lost locks. If you lose your lock, please let your teacher know right away so we can help you find it. Almost all locks that are reported missing the same day are found. It is a lot tougher to find them when you don't tell your teacher right away. No locks from home are permitted. Please contact the P.E. department if you have any further questions.



## DISMISSALS

Students are <u>not</u> permitted to call a parent/guardian to dismiss themselves for any reason.

All dismissals for health reasons are to be through the health office and at the discretion of the school nurse.

Students dismissed before 11:00 AM are considered absent.

Students dismissed after 11:00 AM are considered present for the day.

Students **tardy before 11:00 AM** are considered Tardy Present.

Students **tardy after 11:00 AM** are considered Tardy Absent.

### SCHOOL LOST AND FOUND

#### PHYSICAL EDUCATION

All 6th grade students must bring in \$5.00 for their Phys. Ed. padlock (this is separate from their regular homeroom locker padlock).

All students should bring in a pair of shorts, t-shirt, extra pair of sneakers (optional) and deodorant stick for their first day of Phys. Ed.

### BUS INFORMATION

All bus routes and times will be published in the Braintree Forum and the Patriot Ledger shortly before the opening of school.

East students eligible for transportation in Grades 7 & 8 will be required to pay \$180.00 for the school year. A family cap has been set at \$250.00. Fees will be waived for families eligible for free and/or reduced lunches.


All students in Grade 6, who live less than two miles from school and wish to ride the bus, will also be required to pay \$180.00 to ride the bus for the year. Students in Grade 6 who live more than two miles from the school will be able to ride the bus at no charge.
